**A WORK SESSION: Urban Farming and Food Security**

Sustainability Liaison Babe O'Sullivan provided an overview of urban farming including information about policies, practices, goals, barriers and conditions that may present challenges to a sustainable urban food system.

**Council Discussion/Suggestions/Questions:**

- Highlight food security issues at upcoming economic summit.
- Sustainable food efforts help the entire community as do community gardens.
- Coordinate implementation efforts with existing food security initiatives.
- Support school districts efforts to grow food on-site at schools for use by students.
- Envision Eugene goals conflict with economic development goals.
- Community gardens are popular, program expansion would help food security efforts.
- What policies or codes changes would be needed to change in order to better support urban farming?
- Use vacant City-owned land for temporary public gardens.
- As Envision Eugene develops we will closely examine competing goals of compact urban growth, use of public spaces, sustainable food securities and urban farming.
- Explore concept of "edible parks;" parks with fruit and nut trees.
- Consider expansion of the Farmer's Market.
- Create a Food Policy Task Force.
