# ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 52-25-01-F of the City Manager of the City of Eugene

SETTING AMBULANCE, EMERGENCY AND NON-EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES RATES AND SUPERSEDING THE RATE SCHEDULE ADOPTED BY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 52-23-01-F.

# The City Manager of the City of Eugene finds as follows:

- A. Section 2.020 of the Eugene Code, 1971, authorizes the City Manager to determine and set fees and charges to be imposed by the City for services, goods, use of municipal property, and licenses and permits. In addition, Section 2.608 of the Eugene Code, 1971, specifically authorizes the City Manager to set all rates and fees for any ambulance service operated by the City.
- **B.** Pursuant to the above authority, on May 25, 2023, I issued Administrative Order No. 52-23-01-F establishing the current Ambulance, Emergency and Non-Emergency Medical Services Rate Schedule ("the Rate Schedule").
- C. On April 25, 2025, I issued Administrative Order No. 52-25-01, ordering that notice be given of the opportunity to submit written comments on my proposal to set new Ambulance, Emergency and Non-Emergency Medical Services rates. The Notice specified that comments on the proposed amendments could be submitted in writing until 5 p.m. on May 21, 2025, and that comments could also be submitted in writing and orally at the May 21, 2025, public hearing. There was no testimony at the Public Hearing and no comments were received within the time or in the manner described in the Notice.
- **D.** Based on my investigation pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2.020 and 2.608 of the Eugene Code, 1971, I find that the fees should be set as proposed. (See Exhibit B to this Order)
- **E.** The unamended Ambulance, Emergency and Non-Emergency Medical Services rates adopted by Administrative Order No. 52-23-01-F are incorporated into the Fee Schedule attached as Exhibit A to this Order.

### On the basis of these findings, I order that:

1. The Ambulance, Emergency and Non-Emergency Medical Services Rate Schedule attached as Exhibit A to this Order is the schedule of fees to be charged for the described services effective July 1, 2025.

# Ambulance, Emergency and Non-Emergency Medical Services Rates Schedule (Effective July 1, 2025)

Service Description	Rate
EMERGENCY AND NON-EMERGENCY TRANSPORT RATES	
The City charges an "All Inclusive" Base Rate. There are no additional treatment, medication, or supply charges. The Base Rate becomes effective upon the transport of the patient from the incident.	
Base Rate	\$2,131.00 one way
*Out-of-Area User Base Rate	\$2,384.00 one way
*For purposes of this fee schedule, "out-of-area user" means persons residing outside of the Cities of Eugene and Springfield's fire first response area at the time of service.	
Mileage	\$26.91 per mile

### **MULTIPLE PATIENT SITUATIONS**

When a single ambulance unit transports more than one patient at the same time from the same incident or unrelated incidents, each patient is charged the full base rate; however, an adjustment will be made for mileage charges. In instances where more than one patient is transported in the same ambulance, the mileage charge will be equally divided among the number of patients transported.

# **EXTRA ATTENDANT**

When a patient's condition warrants the presence of additional emergency medical technicians to assist the regular ambulance crew during a transport, a fee for each of the extra attendants will be charged. Situations and conditions where an extra attendant charge is applicable may include, but are not limited to: patients who are critically ill or injured; patients who are violent and combative; or patients who are morbidly obese. In each case, documentation of the need for additional assistance must indicate that additional assistance is necessary.

### **AID CALLS**

The Aid Call rate will apply in lieu of the Emergency or Non-Emergency Transport rate when treatment has been provided to a patient, who, subsequent to treatment, refuses transport or does not meet the "medical necessity" definition for transport. "Medical necessity" is established when the patient's condition is such that the use of any method of transportation other than an ambulance is contraindicated. Ambulance transport is not a medical necessity when some means of transportation other than an ambulance could be used without endangering the patient's health.

FIRST RESPONDER FEE	
The First Responder rates will be used whenever the Fire Department arrives at a location and provides assessment or treatment to the patient who, subsequent to treatment, is transported by ambulance to a health care facility. The fee may be waived if the Fire Chief or the Fire Chief's designee determines that payment of the fee would cause financial hardship to the patient.

WAITING TIME	
If the time an ambulance crew has to wait to pick-up a patient for transport (while unavailable for other calls) is beyond thirty minutes, the waiting time rate will be charged in thirty-minute increments. The reason for the wait time must be documented and the first thirty minutes are not billed but included in the base rate.

# City Manager's Findings Proposed Ambulance, Emergency and Non-Emergency Medical Services Rate Schedule Amendments

• Pursuant to Section 2.020(2) of the Eugene Code, 1971, the City Manager has considered the following factors in determining the proposed Ambulance fees:

## (a) Applicable policies, enactments and directives of the Council.

<u>Findings</u>: Per City Code 2.608, ambulance fee adjustments should: be in the public interest; be adjusted so, except as approved by the Council, they will not draw on general tax revenues of the city; and ensure that those who receive the service pay in proportion to the cost of the service provided. As approved by the City Council through budget actions, the General Fund has transferred funds to the Ambulance Transport fund as follows: FY21 \$804,362; FY22 \$1,250,000 and 2325 \$1.374,000. These funds help with the structural deficit of the Ambulance Transport Fund.

An estimated 81% of transports are related to Medicaid which has a rate cap on how much is paid per transport. Currently, an average of 14.5% of transports are related to the unhoused and are non-billable.

# (b) The amount charged by the City in the past.

<u>Findings</u>: The base rate currently charged by the City for ambulance transport is \$2,020.00, which was approved by the City Manager in May 2023. The new proposed base rate of \$2,131.00 is a 5.5% increase over the current base rate. The out-of-area user base rate currently charged by the City is \$2260.00. The new proposed out-of-area user base rate of \$2,384.00 is a 5.5% increase over the current out-of-area user base rate.

# (c) The full costs of providing the service supported by the fee.

<u>Findings</u>: The budgeted cost for the upcoming FY25-27 biennium for Advanced and Basic Life services is \$31,741,684. The Ambulance Transport Fund is projecting a \$1.1 million deficit for the biennium. Fire is working on decreasing this deficit with the Ambulance Services Redesign and by filling vacancies that will reduce overtime. ESF has engaged in the development of alternate response programs to assist in redirecting 911 utilizers to other more appropriate care services. The FY24 Ground Emergency Transport cost report calculated that the average cost per billed transport in Eugene was \$3,408.96. The economic climate has substantially raised the cost to deliver services in the cost of staff, apparatus, and medical equipment.

The Ambulance Transport Fund has received funding through the Ground Emergency Transport program; the State has recently reduced the Fee for Service reimbursement rate for ambulance services.

## (e) The revenue needs of the City as determined by the adopted city budget.

<u>Findings</u>: Per City Code 2.608, fees should be adjusted so that the Ambulance Transport Fund does not draw on general tax revenues, except as approved by the City Council. The City Council has approved the transfer of funds from the General Fund to the Ambulance Transport fund as follows: FY21 \$804,362; FY22 \$1,250,000 and for the FY2325 biennium \$1,374,000. The proposed fee increases will help fill the structural deficit of the Ambulance Transport Fund and reduce reliance on transfers of general tax revenues from the General Fund.

• Pursuant to Section 2.608(1) of the Eugene Code, 1971, the City Manager has determined that:

## (f) The proposed fees are in the public interest.

<u>Findings</u>: The proposed fees are in the public interest because they will help to support and fund emergency medical response.

Based upon the Lane County Ambulance Service Area Plan, Eugene Springfield Fire is the designated ambulance service provider for the community. Safe, efficient, and reliable emergency transportation is essential for public safety. The proposed fees support the efforts of Eugene Springfield Fire to hire and train EMT's as first responders to incidents and increase survival rates of patients. The proposed fees also support updating and replacing ambulances and the equipment used by EMT's in the care of patients.

# (g) Except as approved by Council, the proposed fees will insure the ambulance service will not draw on the general tax revenues of the City.

<u>Findings</u>: The combination of the proposed fee increases and the redesign of the ambulance transport service should decrease the need for Fire to ask for Council approval to draw on the general tax revenues of the City of Eugene in order to provide ambulance service.

# (h) The proposed fees will insure those who receive the service pay in proportion to the cost of the service provided

<u>Findings</u>: Eugene Springfield Fire tries to bill all transports. If the patient does not pay, their account goes to collection. The patient also has the option to apply for a charitable write-off balance. Eugene Springfield Fire participates in FireMed so patients who have FireMed memberships at the time of transport will have the balance written off after insurance is billed. Additionally, the proposed fees take into account the costs of out-of-area responses and out-of-area users are charged accordingly.
